 Link back to Kings and Queens- Who was the monarch at the time?

Great Fire of London
 Transport- How did people evacuate London?
 Refer back to what transport we know was available at the time
 Kings and Queens- Who was King at the time? Link back to information we know about London from Kings and Queens topic.

Explorers
 Transport- How did different explorers travel?
 Kings and Queens- Who was the monarch at the time?

Mayans
 Link to Ancient Egypt- ancient civilization, pyramids, Gods, writing systems. Civilisation collapse.
 Art- Mayan art and where this fits in with the progression of Art in History (materials used, stories

Romans
 Mayans- link with same time period of South America and British History.
 Explorers and Empire- Roman empire, how did they travel and explore to create their empire.
 Ancient Egypt- pre or post learning on Roman invasion of Egypt. Ideas of Empire, Civilization.
 Stone Age to Iron Age- Roman weaponry, chronological for year group who have previously been taught Year B. Pre-learning for year group who have not.

 Mayans- Idea of empire and Spanish invasion.
 Romans- Empire and exploration to create empire.

 Themes of invasion and conquer link to Romans from LKS2.
 Follows on chronologically from LKS2 and Ancient Greece.
